online and will be recorded.

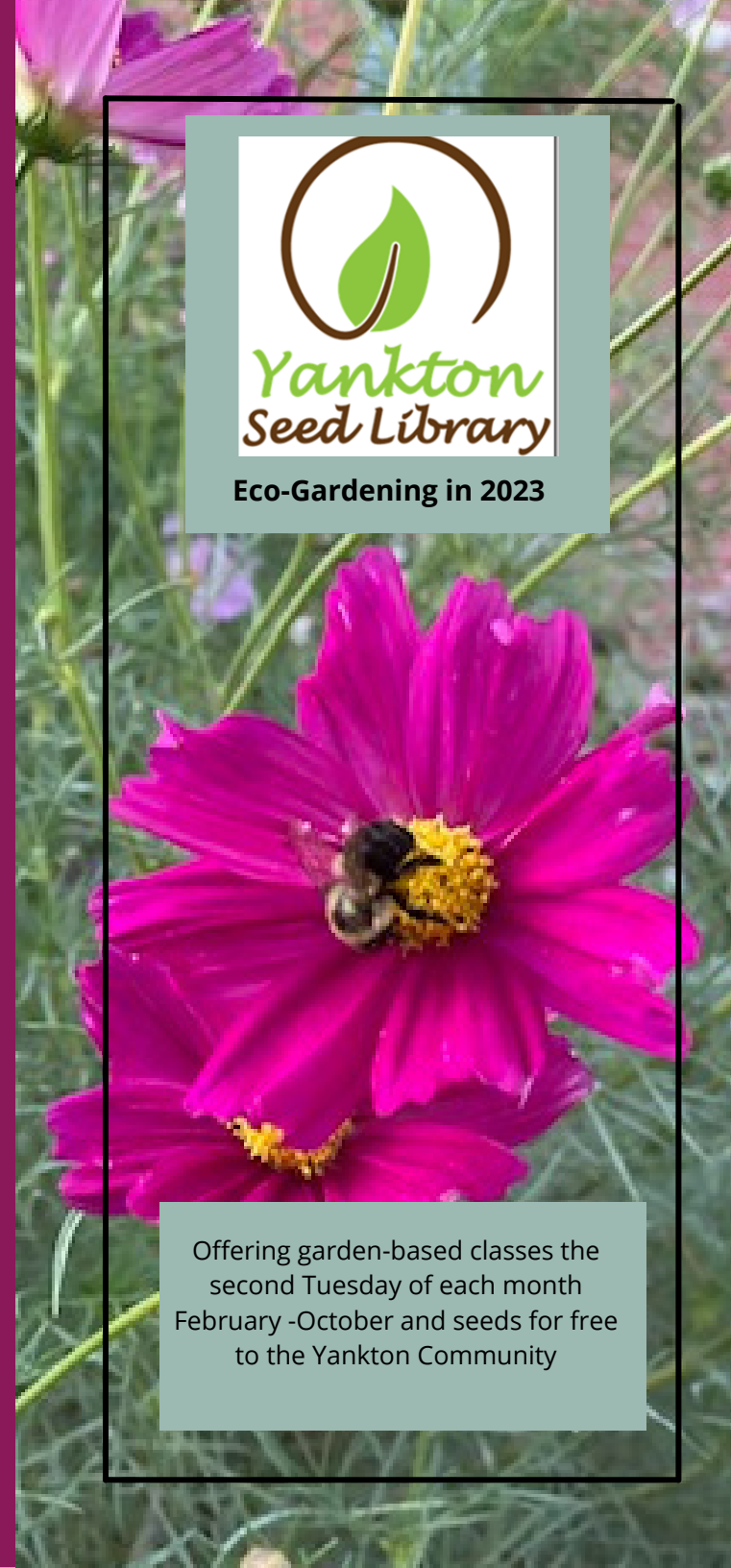
