Non-Agenda Items of Interest

1) Human Resources Update

We had four new employees start employment on May 30, 2016: Taylor Peters, Communications/IT Systems Analyst; Kristi Taylor, Communication Dispatcher; Logan Van Winkle, Sanitation/Truck Operator; and Devin Gullkson, Sanitation/Truck Operator.

Ray Tweedy, Water Plant Superintendent, will be retiring effective June 10, 2016. He has been with the City for 34 years. A reception will be held that day to wish him a happy retirement.

2) Parks and Recreation Department Update

Enclosed in your packet is an update on the various activities in the Parks and Recreation Department.

3) Information Services Update

On the City's website, there are four newly updated, interactive, web mapping applications: a City project construction map, ETJ zoning map, City zoning map, and a City park map. The new maps allow visitors to the website to interact and obtain more information in a cleaner, easier way than before. An updated City-wide trails web map is also currently in the making. In addition to the online web mapping applications, various paper maps have been created for staff to use internally or to use in Commission Meetings including a West City Limit Parcel Tax Evaluation map, a residency requirement map, plat location maps, and prospective road maps. The map formats have been standardized for legibility and consistency throughout the agency.

The City's GIS data is constantly being updated. Sidewalk and ADA Ramp data collected previously is currently being revised and updated for use in additional maps and analysis. Zoning, water, sewer, and City Limit information has been updated to reflect the new Westbrook addition and other recent developments. The updated information has been shared with both Yankton County and Planning & Development District III. Also, the recent 2016 partial Pictometry flight imagery has been received and is available on Pictometry online.

NextGen 911 equipment will start shipping June 13, 2016 with installation, testing and training taking place during the following weeks. The new system is scheduled to go live during the week of June 29. Purchase of the subscriber radios for police is moving forward. We will have a teleconference with Therkelsen & Associates on June 9 and have already received one unsolicited preliminary quote from a vendor for radio equipment. Funding options for the 2nd phase of the project will be included in the 2017 budget.

4) Library Update

Enclosed in your packet is an update on the various activities at the Library Department.

5) Community Development Update

Progress on the property acquisition and management activities associated with the 2017 phase of the East Highway 50 / 4th Street project continues. This is the portion of the project between Marne Creek and Archery Lane. We have possession of all the properties in the 30 foot ROW / utility corridor with the exception of one parcel with a complicated title history. That situation isn't slowing us down because the person managing the property has allowed us to continue anticipating the eventual transfer. The former Frick Hog Buying building has been removed and Northwestern Energy (NWE) already has their new poles installed on the south edge of the 30 foot corridor. The NWE pole installation is the first step in a series of many utility relocates this year in preparation for street construction next year. Tree removal in the 30 foot corridor will begin within a few weeks. Existing trees in that area must come out so the underground utilities can be installed. Grass and trees will be replanted over the utilities after the construction project is completed.

In the beginning of the project there was some question about whether or not there was a need for the full 30 feet of additional property on the south side. As the project design and site preparation has continued, it has become very evident that the 30 feet was the minimum needed to get the project completed. The corridor will be ready for the Department of Transportation road construction project next year.

6) Police Department Update

Ribfest related issues were relatively low. Below is a listing of police calls for service related to Ribfest:

- An individual was arrested for felony drug possession, Simple Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer, Resisting Arrest and Disorderly Conduct.
- A total of 8 noise complaints associated with the bands. There were 3 Friday night and 5 Saturday night.
- A total of 20 hours of overtime was utilized for police at Ribfest.

7) Public Works Department Update

The City Street Department Asphalt Plant has been put into service and the seasonal asphalt patching work is underway.

The Street Department has started the 17th Street and West Street asphalt mat replacement project.

The Transfer Station Entrance Reconfiguration and Scale Replacement project continues to progress. The new scale components have been delivered and work is currently being done to assemble the new unit within the recently constructed "pit" structure. The scale house remodel is also progressing as the interior modifications are nearly complete.

Work on the 15th Street project from West City Limits Road (WCLR) to Dakota Street has commenced. The boring of the sewer line across West City Limits Road has been completed. The underground contractor has mobilized equipment to the site and will begin their work in the near future.

The pavement on the south side of Highway 50 has been completed through the Douglas Avenue intersection. The hope is for Slowey Construction to have all the underground and grading work completed to Broadway Avenue for D&G Construction to pave by June 18. It appears as if they are still on schedule to switch traffic over and start construction on the north side by the July 4 target date.

All the underground utilities have been installed for the Douglas Avenue project. Work continues on grading the project. Masonry Components will be concentrating on completing everything behind the curb line (approaches, sidewalk and grading) prior to mainline paving operations.

The Donohoe Boulevard Extension and Lyons Lane Construction (Cobh Development) plans have been received for review. Staff has been working closely with the Developer's Engineer to coordinate this work with that on the Douglas Avenue project.

The free tire disposal at the Transfer Station will be ending June 24, 2016.

8) Finance Office Update

The Finance Office has a long standing cooperative agreement with the County Auditor's office to assist them during their primary and general elections in turn for their assistance during municipal elections. The Finance Officer and Deputy Finance Officer helped with the tabulation of ballots during the primary election on Tuesday, June 7.

9) Environmental Services Update

Gridor Construction continues to move dirt on the lift station project site. They have started dewatering the site and will be monitoring the water table. Once the site has been dewatered they will begin construction.

Bids were opened on the Water Treatment Plant Membranes. HDR is currently reviewing the bids and verifying the 20 year cost analysis of the two bids received.

The water fill station is currently advertised for bid. This project will locate a new water fill station on east 7th street to replace the existing water fill station at the 1972 plant. This will allow for better truck access and reduce truck traffic near the 1972 plant.

The Notice of Application for the Collector Well Permit was published. The South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources has reviewed the application and recommended approval. If no petitions of opposition are filed the permit will be granted with no hearing. If a petition of opposition is filed a hearing will be scheduled and the Water Management Board will consider the application.

10) Budget Meeting Reminder

As a reminder, we will be holding CIP budget meeting immediately following the City Commission Meeting on Monday, June 13, 2016 at the RTEC in Meeting Room #114. We will also resume CIP budget meetings on Tuesday, June 14, 2016, starting at 5:30 pm in Meeting Room #B, 2nd Floor of City Hall. If we do not complete the budget meetings on Tuesday, we are scheduled for Wednesday, June 15, 2016, starting at 5:30 pm in Meeting Room #B, 2nd Floor of City Hall.

Tom would like to start tracking and focusing on revenue per round comparisons. Todd has this report created and needs to update numbers through the 2015 season.
- B. Revenue report from City financials through end of March (attachment). Expenses are down Y-T-D. Revenue is also down Y-T-D due to weather as it compares to last spring. The Board discussed food prices and the idea of lowering food prices. The board discussed going to a smaller burger than the current ½ pound option. Board felt most patrons would be willing to pay more the golf (green fees, season passes) and then give them a good value in the clubhouse on food and beverage. Keep the patrons around longer so they eat and drink more to help with revenue. The breakfast special in 2016 has been a great addition. Discussed concrete cart paths and the difference in golf staff installing versus outside contractor. More linear feet can be poured using the budgeted funds if the golf staff and park staff are available to do the project. The 2015 fall installation of concrete cart paths used both the 2015 and 2016 budget for cart path installation.
- C. <u>League update</u>. Kevin Doby is working on leagues, schedules, website, and correspondence.
- D. <u>Course event calendar and updates.</u> Tom covered events on the schedule. Some of the events coming up include: May 6th there is a Mother's Day Scramble and YHS Girls Invitation. May 11th there is the Tri-Valley Conference. May 13th is the Poker Scramble.

- May 20th is the Irish Rumble. May 24th is an event outing, and May 27th is the Tall Tee Scramble.
- E. <u>2016-2020 Proposed Capital Improvement Plan.</u> The first step in the 2017 budgeting process is to meet with the Commission and examine the 2016 and 2017 Capital Improvement Plans. Then, in the next couple of months, the review of the entire 2016-2020 CIP will take place at another meeting. Finally, the review and establishment of the 2017 operating budget will take place.
 - The current adopted budge can be found on the City website under the Get Public Documents page. The City budget is listed under Government and Administration. The Golf operating budget starts on page 151.
- F. Course conditions and projects –Rockie. Two weeks ago, the irrigation system was brought online so it is up and running. Will be spraying pre-emergent to help control weeds in the rough. Next week the fairways will be fertilized. Hartington Tree Service will be moving eight trees this spring and there are 8 to 10 more trees identified for moving in the fall of 2016. Fixed the #8 and #10 senior tee box areas this spring. Early in the season, Rockie moved the blue tees back to the golf boxes to help the blue tee boxes recover prior to leagues starting at the end of April. It worked well and he will plan to do that in future years also.

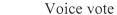

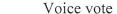

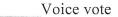

If approved, the attached Ordinance #987 would amend language in the City of Yankton's Sidewalk Café Ordinance to allow the consumption of alcoholic beverages on sidewalks adjacent to licensed establishments that have the appropriate permits. As you know, South Dakota Codified Law was changed this year to allow cities to adopt code changes permitting alcohol consumption on sidewalks abutting a licensed premises. That SDCL will be effective on July 1st.

In addition to adding alcohol consumption as a permitted activity at an approved sidewalk café, the proposed changes also provide for some flexibility in the location of the pedestrian zone on a sidewalk. Currently, the pedestrian zone must be adjacent to the curb zone. The curb zone is the first two feet next to the curb. The amended language would allow applicants to propose the location of the pedestrian zone as a part of the application process. As always, the primary purpose of the sidewalk is to provide a clearly identifiable corridor for pedestrian traffic and we feel the amended language would adequately protect that purpose while allowing the business owner some ability to customize the café layout.

If this Ordinance is approved, another issue that the City Commission may want to consider is the fee the City charges for a permit. The current annual permit fee is \$25. While there is not a direct correlation between the fee and the city resources committed to manage the process, it is evident that if approved, management of the provisions in the revised ordinance will be more time consuming. The fee is established by simple resolution so if the Commission wanted a change, it could be included in the June 27th meeting agenda.

ORDINANCE NO. 987

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 886 ALLOWING SIDEWALK CAFES AND THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON DESIGNATED AREAS OF SIDEWALKS IN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE B-3 CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT AND CREATING REGULATIONS BY WHICH THEY WILL BE PERMITTED

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF YANKTON, SOUTH DAKOTA THAT THE FOLLOWING CODES OF THE CITY ORDINANCES BE AMENDED AND RECREATED TO WIT:

CHAPTER 3

Sec. 3-15. - Sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages on public sidewalk.

The City Commission of the City of Yankton charged with the approval of alcoholic beverage license issuance may permit the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages on a sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way abutting a licensed premises. The sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way shall be immediately adjacent to and abutting the licensed premises. This section does not apply to any federal-aid eligible highway unless approved in accordance with the applicable requirements for the receipt of federal aid.

The city commission further imposes the conditions or restrictions that appear in Chapter 13, article I, section 13-2 through 13-5, Sidewalk cafes permitted in certain areas; regulations.

The sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way where the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages is permitted does not constitute a public place as defined in SDCL 35-1-5.3, if the sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way has been properly authorized for sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages pursuant to this section. The hours of authorized sale and consumption on the sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way as provided by this section shall be consistent with the hours permitted for the on-sale license.

A violation of any provision of SDCL Title 35 by an alcoholic beverage license holder conducting business on a sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way pursuant to this section constitutes a violation of SDCL Title 35 as if the violation had occurred in or on the licensed premises.

CHAPTER 13. ARTICLE I

Section 13-2.

Outdoor Food and Beverage Service and Dining, including the consumption of alcoholic beverages, in the defined area of the B-3, Central Business District. Permits are available on an annual basis following the calendar year.

Outdoor food and beverage service and dining areas permitted along and on both sides of those portions of the identified Rights-of-Way located in the City of Yankton's B-3 Central Business District. Only those areas being both in the B-3 District and identified below are allowed to request a sidewalk café permit.

Area identified as:

- 1. Third Street from Broadway Avenue, east to Burleigh Street.
- 2. Second Street from Broadway Avenue, east to Burleigh Street.
- 3. Riverside Drive and Levee Street from Broadway Avenue, east to Burleigh Street.
- 4. Cedar Street, Walnut Street, Douglas Avenue, Capital Street, Pine Street, Mulberry Street, Pearl Street and Picotte Street from Riverside Drive / Levee Street, north to Fourth Street.

Outdoor food and beverage service and dining, including the consumption of alcoholic beverages, is permitted on sidewalks in the defined area of the Central Business District by the owner or operator whose business is adjacent to the sidewalk upon which the food and beverages are to be sold, served or consumed. Outdoor sales and service of food, beverages and outdoor dining, including the consumption of alcoholic beverages, in the Central Business District shall be subject to the regulations set forth in this ordinance.

Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply when used in this ordinance.

B-3 Central Business District means the zoning district defined by that name in the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Yankton.

Outdoor dining area means an area on a public sidewalk in front of and adjacent to a licensed business where food or beverages are sold, served or consumed.

Sidewalk means all that area legally open to public use as a pedestrian public way between the curb line and the public right-of-way boundary along the abutting property.

Public Sidewalk Use Zones shall be defined as:

- 1. Curb zone: Two feet from the face of the curb toward the private property line.
- 2. Pedestrian zone: A five foot wide corridor on the sidewalk not including the curb zone.
- 3. Sidewalk Café Permit Zone: Remaining area of the public sidewalk not included in the curb zone or pedestrian zone. Sidewalk cafes may be located in this zone.

Location of the Pedestrian Zone: The applicant shall propose the location of the pedestrian zone in front of their licensed establishment at the time of application for a permit. The Applicant shall preserve a clearly identifiable and easily navigable pedestrian zone. The City Commission may adjust the location of the requested pedestrian zone as a part of their action on the application. The location of other established pedestrian zones in the area will be taken into consideration when establishing a new pedestrian zone. Once approved, the location of the pedestrian zone cannot change without City Commission action in the form of an amendment to an existing permit, or as a part of the annual renewal process.

Regulations pertaining to outdoor food and beverage service and dining areas in the central business district.

- (1) No person shall sell or serve food or beverages or permit outdoor dining on a sidewalk in the defined area unless they comply with the requirements of this ordinance.
- (2) Pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law, city licensing requirements and the provisions of this ordinance, alcoholic beverages may be sold, served or consumed on a public sidewalk.
- (3) Outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining shall be located so that such service and dining does not impede, endanger or interfere with pedestrian traffic. Tables, chairs and benches shall be located so that they do not impede, endanger or interfere with pedestrian traffic, with a minimum of five feet of passage for pedestrian traffic as defined in the above described public sidewalk use zones. Sidewalk cafes shall only be allowed in the "Sidewalk Café Permit Zone" of the public sidewalk.
- (4) No fixtures or devices on which food or beverages are sold or consumed shall be attached to the sidewalk or other public area.
- (5) Outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining will be permitted only on sidewalks that are adjacent to the building or structure in which the business providing the outdoor food and beverage service is located.
- (6) Tables, chairs and benches shall not block regulatory signs, crosswalks or intersections and shall be sufficiently lit during times of low light in order to provide for safe pedestrian passage alongside the outdoor dining area. All tables, chairs and benches shall not have sharp edges, protrusions, or other features which may be hazardous to the public.
- (7) All equipment used for food and beverage sales or consumption shall be moved inside the building wherein the business is located during hours the business is not in operation, unless the tables and chairs are secured to the building, or secured together in a preapproved fashion or constructed of such material and placed in a manner that they cannot inadvertently move.
- (8) All tables, chairs and benches must be managed so that they may not be dislodged during windy or stormy weather.
- (9) The business owner or operator who conducts outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining shall be responsible for the maintenance, upkeep and security of all tables, chairs and benches.
- (10) The business owner or operator who conducts outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining shall be responsible for keeping the outdoor service area clean of garbage, trash, paper, cups, cans or litter associated with the operation of the outdoor dining area.

- (11) Signs used to advertise to the outdoor food or beverage sales and the outdoor dining area shall meet all applicable sign regulations and be secured so that they are not dislodged during windy or stormy weather.
- (12) The applicant requesting the permit agrees to assume all liability associated with the sidewalk café activities and hold the City of Yankton "harmless" in matters associated with the operation of said café.
- (13) The City of Yankton has established a fee for a sidewalk café permit by resolution. Said resolution may be amended as determined by the Board of City Commissioners without impacting the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 13-3. Violations / Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance or refuses to comply with or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance may have their permit revoked and is further subject to the penalties described in Section 1-8 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Yankton, South Dakota.

Section 13-4. Saving Clause.

Should any section, clause, or provision of this ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 13-5. Effective Clause.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE <u>AMENDING ORDINANCE 886</u> ALLOWING SIDEWALK CAFES <u>AND THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON</u>
<u>DESIGNATED AREAS OF SIDEWALKS</u> IN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE B-3
CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT AND CREATING REGULATIONS BY
WHICH THEY WILL BE PERMITTED

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF YANKTON, SOUTH DAKOTA THAT THE FOLLOWING CODES OF THE CITY ORDINANCES BE AMENDED AND RECREATED TO WIT:

CHAPTER 3

Sec. 3-15. - Sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages on public sidewalk.

The City Commission of the City of Yankton charged with the approval of alcoholic beverage license issuance may permit the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages on a sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way abutting a licensed premises, provided that the license holder derives more than fifty (50) percent of its gross receipts from the sale of prepared food for consumption on the licensed premises. The sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way shall be immediately adjacent to and abutting the licensed premises. This section does not apply to any federal-aid eligible highway unless approved in accordance with the applicable requirements for the receipt of federal aid.

The city commission further imposes the conditions or restrictions that appear in Chapter 13, article I, section 13-2 through 13-5, Sidewalk cafes permitted in certain areas; regulations.

The sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way where the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages is permitted does not constitute a public place as defined in SDCL 35-1-5.3, if the sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way has been properly authorized for sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages pursuant to this section. The hours of authorized sale and consumption on the sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way as provided by this section shall be consistent with the hours permitted for the on-sale license.

A violation of any provision of SDCL Title 35 by an alcoholic beverage license holder conducting business on a sidewalk or walkway subject to a public right-of-way pursuant to this section constitutes a violation of SDCL Title 35 as if the violation had occurred in or on the licensed premises.

CHAPTER 13. ARTICLE I

Section 13-2.

Outdoor Food and Beverage Service and Dining, including the consumption of alcoholic beverages, in the defined area of the B-3, Central Business District. Permits are available on an annual basis following the calendar year.

Outdoor food and beverage service and dining areas permitted along and on both sides of those portions of the identified Rights-of-Way located in the City of Yankton's B-3 Central Business District. Only those areas being both in the B-3 District and identified below are allowed to request a sidewalk café permit.

Area identified as:

- 1. Third Street from Broadway Avenue, east to Burleigh Street.
- 2. Second Street from Broadway Avenue, east to Burleigh Street.
- 3. Riverside Drive and Levee Street from Broadway Avenue, east to Burleigh Street.
- 4. Cedar Street, Walnut Street, Douglas Avenue, Capital Street, Pine Street, Mulberry Street, Pearl Street and Picotte Street from Riverside Drive / Levee Street, north to Fourth Street.

Outdoor food and beverage service and dining, including the consumption of alcoholic beverages, is permitted on sidewalks in the defined area of the Central Business District by the owner or operator whose business is adjacent to the sidewalk upon which the food and beverages are to be sold, served or consumed. Outdoor sales and service of food, beverages and outdoor dining, including the consumption of alcoholic beverages, in the Central Business District shall be subject to the regulations set forth in this ordinance.

Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply when used in this ordinance.

B-3 Central Business District means the zoning district defined by that name in the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Yankton.

Outdoor dining area means an area on a public sidewalk in front of and adjacent to a licensed business where food or beverages are sold, served or consumed.

Sidewalk means all that area legally open to public use as a pedestrian public way between the curb line and the public right-of-way boundary along the abutting property.

Public Sidewalk Use Zones shall be defined as:

- 1. Curb zone: Two feet from the face of the curb toward the private property line.
- 2. Pedestrian zone: A five foot wide corridor on the sidewalk not including the curb zone. Five feet adjacent to the curb zone toward the private property line. Five feet adjacent to the curb zone toward the private property line.
- 3. <u>Sidewalk Café Permit Zone</u>: <u>Frontage zone</u>: <u>Frontage zone</u>: <u>Rremaining area of the public sidewalk not included in the curb zone or pedestrian zone</u>. between the

pedestrian zone and the private property line. All permittedbetween the pedestrian zone and the private property line. All permitted—Ssidewalk cafes shall shall may be located in this zone.

Location of the Pedestrian Zone: The applicant shall propose the location of the pedestrian zone in front of their licensed establishment at the time of application for a permit. The Applicant shall preserve a clearly identifiable and easily navigable pedestrian zone. The City Commission may adjust the location of the requested pedestrian zone as a part of their action on the application. The location of other established pedestrian zones in the area will be taken into consideration when establishing a new pedestrian zone. Once approved, the location of the pedestrian zone cannot change without City Commission action in the form of an amendment to an existing permit, or as a part of the annual renewal process.

Regulations pertaining to outdoor food and beverage service and dining areas in the central business district.

- (1) No person shall sell or serve food or beverages or permit outdoor dining on a sidewalk in the defined area unless they comply with the requirements of this ordinance.
- (2) Pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law, none city licensing requirements and the provisions of this ordinance, alcoholic beverages may be sold, served or consumed on a public sidewalk.
- (3) Outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining shall be located so that such service and dining does not impede, endanger or interfere with pedestrian traffic. Tables, chairs and benches shall be located so that they do not impede, endanger or interfere with pedestrian traffic, with a minimum of five feet of passage for pedestrian traffic as defined in the above described public sidewalk use zones. Sidewalk cafes shall only be allowed in the "Sidewalk Café Permit Zone Frontage zoneFrontage Zone" of the public sidewalk.
- (4) No fixtures or devices on which food or beverages are sold or consumed shall be attached to the sidewalk or other public area.
- (5) Outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining will be permitted only <u>on</u> <u>sidewalks that are</u> adjacent to the building or structure in which the business providing the outdoor food and beverage service is located.
- (6) Tables, chairs and benches shall not block regulatory signs, crosswalks or intersections and shall be sufficiently lit during times of low light in order to provide for safe pedestrian passage alongside the outdoor dining area. All tables, chairs and benches shall not have sharp edges, protrusions, or other features which may be hazardous to the public.
- (7) All equipment used for food and beverage sales or consumption shall be moved inside the building wherein the business is located during hours the business is not in operation, unless the tables and chairs are secured to the building, or or secured together in a preapproved fashion or constructed of such material and placed in a manner that they cannot inadvertently move.
- (8) All tables, chairs and benches must be managed so that they may not be dislodged during windy or stormy weather.

- (9) The business owner or operator who conducts outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining shall be responsible for the maintenance, upkeep and security of all tables, chairs and benches.
- (10) The business owner or operator who conducts outdoor food or beverage sales and outdoor dining shall be responsible for keeping the outdoor service area clean of garbage, trash, paper, cups, cans or litter associated with the operation of the outdoor dining area.
- (11) Signs used to advertise to the outdoor food or beverage sales and the outdoor dining area shall meet all applicable sign regulations and be secured so that they are not dislodged during windy or stormy weather.
- (12) The applicant requesting the permit agrees to assume all liability associated with the sidewalk café activities and hold the City of Yankton "harmless" in matters associated with the operation of said café.
- (13) The City of Yankton has established a fee for a sidewalk café permit by resolution. Said resolution may be amended as determined by the Board of City Commissioners without impacting the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 13-3. Violations / Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance or refuses to comply with or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance may have their permit revoked and is further subject to the penalties described in Section 1-8 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Yankton, South Dakota.

Section 13-4. Saving Clause.

Should any section, clause, or provision of this ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 13-5. Effective Clause.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

On April 25, 2016 the Yankton City Commission met in a study session regarding the possibility of implementing Single stream recycling in our community. At that study session, staff provided an overview of a curbside implementation program for single stream recycling as well as automated solid waste collection.

The details of how staff would propose that program work and would be funded is found in the program description.

The direction given to staff as a result of this study session was to continue discussions with Vermillion City staff to ensure their understanding of the proposed program and how it would impact operations with the Joint Powers Authority. That has been completed. Vermillion understands our initiative, however, they will not be making any changes to their recycling collection program.

In addition, staff was asked to bring the issue of single stream recycling and automated solid waste collection to a regular City Commission meeting in order for the public to gain an understanding of the process and what the cost associated with this new program may be.

The purpose of tonight's discussion will be to provide information to the public and for the City Commission to act on whether or not to proceed with a single stream recycling and automated solid waste collection Program in Yankton.

The Commission is requested to take formal action so that clear direction is provided for budgeting, grant writing, and equipment purchasing purposes. In order to implement the program in spring of 2017, many of these steps need to be executed throughout this summer and fall.

Program Description

If the City Commission would like to implement single stream recycling, staff recommends implementing a curbside solid waste and recycle cart collection program. Within this program, each City of Yankton residence that is on the solid waste curbside collection list would receive a 95 gallon garbage roll cart and a 95 gallon single stream recycle roll cart. The 95 gallon garbage roll cart would take the place of the current two 33 gallon garbage cans the residents use to place their garbage in. The garbage roll cart would still be collected weekly. The 95 gallon single stream recycle roll cart would be used to collect recyclables and would be collected curbside every other week. Residents would continue to place their garbage and recycle carts curbside by 7 AM on their designated collection day. The every

other week schedule for curbside recycling would remain the same. In the future, the schedule may need to move to a weekly schedule.

Roll Cart Collection

City staff would utilize the existing City trucks to collect the garbage and recyclables from the roll carts placed curbside. The existing trucks would have automated 'tippers' mounted to the rear that would lift and empty the carts into the trucks. Staff would wheel the cart from the curb to the rear of the truck, allow the automated tipper to empty the cart, and then wheel the empty cart back to the curb. This semi-automated method would allow current alley collected homes to continue to utilize their alleys for garbage and recycle collection. The current daily routes would initially remain the same, but can be adjusted as the program matures.

The collected garbage would be emptied from the truck at the City Transfer Station and hauled to Vermillion in the same manner it does now. Single stream recycling would be emptied from the trucks to a designated spot on the tipping floor at the Transfer Station. Empting on the tipping floor would allow for inspection of materials collected as well as mixing of the material. Once enough recycle material is collected on the tipping floor, it would be loaded into a walking floor semitrailer where it would be stored until the trailer is full. Once full, the trailer would be taken to Millennium in Sioux Falls for processing. It is anticipated that at full potential 70 tons per month of recyclable material could be collected which would be approximately 7 loads hauled to Sioux Falls per month.

Explanation of Costs

Education would be crucial for the program's success. Public Service Announcements, advertisements, use of social media, community groups such as Keep Yankton Beautiful, and information distributed with the new carts would be used to ensure as much information as possible is provided. It is estimated \$20,000 would be needed initially, and \$5,000 per year thereafter. Attachment "A" contains example educational materials.

New roll carts would be 95 gallons in size and have lids, handles, and large wheels for easy moving. Each cart would have its own serial number for tracking purposes. The City Logo would be hot stamped on the cart along with the words "Recycle" or "Garbage" on the side. There would also be instructions on the lid for what can be placed in the containers. It is anticipated the garbage carts would be black in color and the recycle carts would be red in color (Yankton Bucks and Gazelles). Initially 4,500 garbage carts and 4,500 recycle carts would be ordered. Each cart costs approximately \$70 per cart. If every customer requested a recycle cart, the initial 9,000 new carts would total \$630,000. Attachment "B" contains cart information.

Existing trucks would need the semi-automated tippers mounted to the rear of each truck. Three existing trucks would have two tippers mounted and one existing packer truck would have one tipper mounted. The single tipper truck would act as a backup collection truck. The tippers cost approximately \$8,000 per tipper installed. The initial cost for seven tippers installed would total \$56,000. Attachment "C" contains tipper information.

Small modifications to the recycle area of the Transfer Station building would be required. Additional concrete barriers and a push plate for the skid loader to move material on the tipping floor would be necessary. It is estimated these modifications would cost approximately \$5,000.

Hauling the material to Millennium would be done by City staff using an existing semi-tractor and walking floor trailer. The cost for a round trip to Sioux Falls hauling 10 tons per trip is estimated to be \$400 per trip. If 70 tons of material is collected per month, the total material per year would be 840 tons. The yearly cost to haul material to Sioux Falls would be approximately \$33,600. If the City were to purchase a used semi-tractor and a new walking floor trailer to be used specifically for single stream recycle hauling, the estimated additional costs would be \$65,000 and \$80,000, respectfully.

Currently there is no charge for dropping clean, loose, single stream recyclable material at the Millennium facility in Sioux Falls. Attachment "D" contains Millennium's Recycle Guide.

The "high-cost" cost estimate for the initial implementation of the curbside cart program would include: education at \$20,000, carts at \$630,000, tippers at \$56,000, semi-tractor and trailer at \$145,000, and tipping floor modifications at \$5,000, totaling \$856,000.

Funding

The City is eligible to apply for South Dakota Solid Waste Management Program Grant and Loan Funding. An effort to improve the City's Waste Collection and Recycling Program may fulfill the South Dakota Solid Waste Management Program requirements.

The current monthly household solid waste collection rate is \$17.13 per month plus tax. Attachment "E" outlines cost scenarios. It is estimated that if no outside funding is received, the City purchases a used semi and new trailer, and every customer receives a recycle cart, the monthly solid waste collection rate would increase \$2.54 per month plus tax. It is estimated that if 50% grant funding is received for the carts, the City does not purchase a used semi and new trailer, and every customer receives a recycle cart, the monthly solid waste collection rate would increase \$1.52 per month plus tax.

Other Communities

The City of Brookings and the City of Yankton have very similar amounts of residential garbage accounts. In 2008, Brookings implemented Single stream recycling and in 2013 started the automated cart system. Attachment "F" is an article from the Brookings Register from July 7, 2015 describing their City's experience with their recycle collection change.

The City of Watertown converted from dual stream recycling to Single stream recycling between 2012 and 2013. The City's 2013 single stream recycle collection of 645 tons was 59% higher than the dual stream recycle tennage collected in 2012. Tan 95 gallon recycle carts are available for residents to use. The Residents must make a request to their City Sanitation Department or complete a request form online to have a container delivered to their home. Recyclable materials are collected curbside biweekly.

The City of Pierre provides recycle drop off bins at three locations in their City. The City residents may also pay a commercial collector \$8 to have their single stream recycle collected curbside.

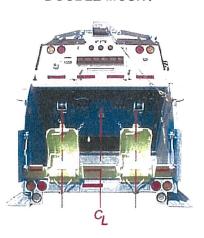

7/7/15 – Recycling numbers grow in Brookings

BROOKINGS Landfills play a quiet role in a city's quality of life, and that's no different in Brookings, thanks to the Brookings Regional Landfill's residential recycling program.

According to Todd Langland, the director of solid waste management at the landfill, Brookings stands as one of the top recycling communities in the state, perhaps in the top five.

"We do really well," he said. Although cities like Rapid City and Sioux Falls easily rank higher, "I'd say it's probably a toss between us, Vermillion and Watertown. We're kind of on the same level."

The residential recycling program got its start back in 1997 with what was called a two-sort system. This meant that residents taking part in the program had to sort plastic into one bag and paper into another bag for the city to pick up.

It wasn't until 2008 that the recycling program switched to a single stream system that allowed all recyclables to be put into one bag, with another company taking care of the sorting after the landfill delivers it to them.

It's much more streamlined as a result, Langland said. Before the single stream system, they had two trucks going on a route.

"One truck would go around and the guys would have to look into the bags OK, paper, take that one. The next guy would come up and, yup, plastic, and he'd take that one. We'd separate it by truck. If you think of just the cost, the man-hours, the fuel. To us, it was a big financial savings," Langland said. "We went from having two operators on a truck to one. That's why we haven't had to add extra staff, either."

When they switched the program to single stream, Langland noticed an increase in the amount of recyclables collected, going up from 1997's 45-ton monthly average to 2008's 52-ton monthly average. Why the increase?

Langland speculated reasons for the increase. One possibility is that people just couldn't be bothered with sorting recyclables with the twosort system but then joined the more convenient single stream system when that came around.

But Langland believes that changing attitudes throughout the years along with educating the public about recycling and the systems used played a major role.

"When you start programs, this community seems to really embrace them," he said, but added that there were and are some challenges to the program's success. For starters is the throwaway culture, which Langland tries to counter by educating youth and the general public.

In general, Langland sees millenials as being better recyclers than those in his own generation. Older generations that went through the Great Depression and rationing during WWII already found ways to recycle in their own ways.

These days, the recycling program continues to steadily increase its participation rate and its average monthly tonnage .

Key to gaining more participants has been the iconic blue recycling bins beside the regular garbage bins. The recycling bins were introduced in 2013 and helped the landfill automate the collection process, reducing time and labor requirements.

"At that time, before the carts started, we figure we had 65 percent of our residential customers recycling, which is a very good number. The national average right now " is anywhere from 45 to 65 as we speak," Langland said. "We implemented the carts and after one full year on that cart system, we went from 52 tons a month to 68. We saw a big increase and a big increase in

participation."

With the manual system, they had 65 percent of residential customers recycling; today, that number's grown to 77 percent. In total, the landfill has 4,900 residential garbage accounts with 3,800 of them recycling.

"When we started putting those carts out, we put them out for the people that we knew recycled. It wasn't a month before the phone started ringing off the wall. We figured we've gained 800-900 homes that are recycling," he said. The visibility of the bins may have been a key part in gaining those 800-900 homes, with a bit of "Keeping up with the Joneses" coming into play.

"When we started putting those carts out in Indian Hills, we would go down a block and maybe two houses would have them. Then, all of a sudden, they'd all have them," Langland said. State helped

The landfill was able to get the carts thanks to a grant that allowed them to pay for thousands of recycling carts.

"There was no extra cost to the residents. We took the carts out, and the state of South Dakota paid for them," Langland said.

He added, "I've had various people say they have more in their recycling cart than they do in their garbage cart. And that's what you want to hear."

This high level of participation and acceptance by the community helps to extend the life of the landfill itself by moving the 70-some tons of waste each month out of the landfill and to a recycling center.

"All of our recycling material we collect is dropped off down (at Cook's Waste Paper and Recycling). They actually ship it off to Millennium Recycling down in Sioux Falls, and they sort it, process it. What they do at Cook's is bale it into 800-pound bales, then Millennium separates the plastic out. They have a big machine that goes through and separates the plastic and the paper, and they market it from there."

The two biggest opportunities for making money back from recyclables have been in cardboard and aluminum. "Plastic is getting a lot better," Langland said. "Paper is hit and miss still."

Still, Langland has worked on spreading word about the program and the need for it, talking to service clubs like Lions as well as at South Dakota State University. The Sustainability Council has also been helpful.

"I think the word is out there now. We've got a really great community," Langland said, adding that it's easy to get started with the recycling program.

"Just call us," Langland encouraged. "Call the landfill. All we need is your name and address and we'll get a bin out to you. There's no cost for the recycling bin; it's our responsibility to maintain it."

The only rules about it are to keep the bin clean and to use bags with the bins, which helps them when emptying the bins on those windy days.
