Commission Information Memorandum

The Yankton City Commission meeting on Monday, August 8, 2016, will begin at 7:00 pm.

Non-Agenda Items of Interest

1) Human Resources Update

We are doing external advertising for a Water Reclamation Plant Operations Specialist and for a Water Plant Operations Specialist. We advertised both positions internally for one week but did not receive the number of applications needed to keep it internal. The Water Reclamation Plant position closes on August 8 and the Water Plant position will close on August 16.

2) Information Services Update

We are awaiting delivery of the newly ordered subscriber radios. We hope to have delivery and installation in the next couple of weeks. City staff has initiated review of an engineering design services proposal from Therkelsen & Associates for the new proposed P25 radio site. Once the details of the proposal are finalized, it will be brought to the City Commission for review and approval.

3) Finance Department Update

The City of Yankton's 2015 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report has been submitted to the South Dakota Department of Legislative Audit (DLA). Approval is anticipated in the coming weeks. Copies will be distributed to the commission once final approval is complete.

4) Community Development Department Update

Joe Morrow attended a South Dakota Building Officials continuing education seminar in Rapid City. Topics covered included the National Fire Protection Association's (NFPA) fire alarm code updates and proposed 2017 legislation by the South Dakota Chapter of the American Society of Heating and Airconditioning Engineers (ASHRAE). The ASHRAE Chapter is proposing updates to the existing International Energy Conservation Code. The proposed changes are housekeeping measures to comply with the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, where grant monies are used to finance public buildings and infrastructure improvements.

5) Parks and Recreation Department Update

Enclosed in your packet is an update on the various activities in the Parks and Recreation Department.

6) Public Works Department Update

The curb and gutter on 15th Street East of West City Limits Road has been installed. Backfill behind the curb has begun. Mainline paving will commence in the near future.

On the Highway 50 project, all the underground work from Broadway Avenue to Douglas Avenue is expected to be done by August 5th. The aggregate base installation from Broadway to east of Walnut is

scheduled to begin once the underground work is complete. Paving operations will not take place until after Riverboat Days.

The second phase of paving for the Douglas Avenue project has concluded. There are three more phases of paving planned in order to allow access for the local traffic. Depending on the contractors schedule and weather the mainline paving could be completed and open to traffic as early as the last week of August.

The new scale at the Transfer Station has been put into service and the old scale has been removed. The contractor is now concentrating on the new pavement on the east portion of the project. Traffic is currently being routed on the west side of the office building.

The Street Department has been chip sealing various streets and parking lots throughout the City. Paving of the Street Department reconstruction projects in Summit Heights and on 20th Street is anticipated to take place the week of August 8th.

7) Police Department Update

Yankton Police have received quite a bit of attention from the community in recent days. In a show of appreciation, we have received food in the office as a token of appreciation. We have also been invited to businesses in the community for social gatherings, as a symbol of support and appreciation in the Yankton Community.

YPD conducted formal interviews on Wednesday August 3rd for the position of Patrolman. This opening was created with the resignation of Tyler Heine. Our newest hire, Preston Crissey has moved into phase II of the PTO program.

We transfer Officer Dan Thompson back to School Resource Officer on August 22nd. Dan has been helping out on patrol during the summer months.

Our next big event will be Riverboat Days which generally runs like a well-oiled machine. Staffing will be similar to previous years.

8) Fire Department Update

The Yankton Fire Department held their Employer Appreciation Dinner on August 1 at Fire Station #2. Annually the volunteer firefighters prepare a meal for employers and their co-workers to honor them for their willingness to allow them to be a part of the Yankton Volunteer Fire Department by allowing them to leave for calls as needed. Approximately 65 bosses and firefighters attended the event.

The Yankton Fire Department participated in the Together We Are One event in Memorial Park on August 2. Attendees were able to crawl through the smokehouse and fire truck cards and other items were given out.

9) Library Update

Enclosed in your packet is an update on the various activities in the Library.

10) Environmental Services Update

Distribution staff is repairing hydrants and exercising valves. The collection staff is finishing up the annual sewer flushing. Staff flushes 1/3 of the sewer system each year.

The collector well continues to move forward. The exterior is scheduled to be completed in the next two weeks. Final completion is scheduled for this fall.

The water plant staff is working on several options to try and reduce THM's. Staff has switched to a different carbon that we hope will remove more of the organics that cause the THM's. Staff will also be adding Sodium Permanganate in an effort to reduce THM formation and increase hydrant flushing in certain areas to reduce water age. THM's form slowly in the distribution system and are at higher levels in areas where the water age in higher. The new technology planned for our new plant should be better at mitigating THM's.

The wastewater staff has been experiencing an increase in filamentous bacteria in the treatment process. These larger filamentous bacteria cause issues with treatment process by not allowing particles to settle. We believe the water being returned from the lagoons is causing the issue. Currently the lagoon water is blended with the influent and treated. Staff has been approved by the South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources to begin batch treating the lagoon water and blending it with the final effluent from the plant just prior to the disinfection process. Staff has also been approved to begin chlorinating within the treatment process to control the filamentous bacteria.

The seasonal summer staff will be done working for the Parks Department the week of August 8.

The Parks staff have installed new trash can holders in Riverside Park. The wood trash can holders that were in the park are being replaced by the plastic-coated metal holders. This effort started in 2015 and the majority of wood holders have been replaced in 2016.

The Parks staff added a significant amount of agri-lime to the infield of the Riverside Softball Field. Some sod was removed from the outfield/infield edge and agri-lime was placed in this area also. The agri-lime was built up at the pitcher's mound and sloped to the outside edges of the infield to help with drainage.

The Westside Park fountain is repaired and back. The pump company is now telling us that the issue with the pump stems from the artesian well and the hardness of the water in the pond. The recommendation from the company is to pull the fountain every two weeks and clean the fins and impeller to eliminate the deposit of minerals which is causing the problems with the pump.

The 4th Street fountain has been turned off until after the 4th Street road construction project has finished grading and pouring of concrete. The fountain and wind cause water to end up in the construction zone.

Todd will work with the Sertoma Club to have shade structures placed above the home plate bleachers on both north fields at Sertoma Park. The poles and shade tarps are being donated by the Sertoma Club. The poles will be placed by the parks department.

Todd and Brittany LaCroix have been working to finalize a Special Events Application and Handbook which will be reviewed by the City Commission at the August 22 work session.

The Parks staff are working on maintaining and repairing irrigation systems as the hot dry weather has required the irrigation system in parks and boulevards to be in high demand.

The Parks Staff are delivering picnic tables, benches, trash cans, dumpsters, fence, and other event support materials as scheduled prior to the community's weekend events.

The ball fields at Memorial Park, Sertoma Park, Summit Activities Center, and Riverside Park are being dragged and prepared each weekday according to game schedules submitted to the Parks Department.

So far the PAB has gathered input from the youth sports groups and tried to determine needs and not wants. Now the PAB needs to get the youth groups together to start a task force to be the driving force for gathering public input and creating momentum for the project. There has been work done and planning by the Parks Department to fix up current facilities, but that will be a slow process and it is for small improvements. The ultimate project will have current facilities upgrades and maybe some new facilities. Challenges will be getting young people out to vote while also educating the seniors to get them to vote yes on the project.

COMMENTS: The proposed rezoning is owner petition initiated. The owner submitted a rezoning petition representing 14 of the 22 eligible properties (over 60 percent) within 250 feet of the site. This meets the 14 needed properties represented in order to bring the issue before the City for consideration. The immediate purpose for the request is to provide for the possibility of a self-storage facility on the northern portion of the site. If approved, improvements on other areas would need to conform to the requirements of a new zoning district. The allowance of a self-storage facility would also require the associated conditional use permit to be approved (to be requested later if this is approved).

The proposed B-2 business district is the City's standard commercial zoning designation. The outside storage of items is not allowed in the B-2 district and the display of items for sale is restricted. In addition to business activities that would fit under the above definition, the B-2 district also allows multiple family types of residential development. The area is bordered by a high density residential district to the west, business district to the north and industrial district across the street to the east.

Roll Call

It is staff's opinion that the proposal provides the best opportunity to develop the site with the least impact on area residential occupancies. The proposal is essentially an extension of the transition zone between the industrial use to the east and the adjoining high density residential land to the west.

The appropriate public notice was published and individual notifications have been sent out prior to this public hearing. Staff has only received one call from an area property owner subsequent to providing notice. The caller requested more detailed information and stated that they were not opposed to the rezoning.

Staff recommends approval of the proposed owner petition initiated rezoning of the described land from R-4 Multiple Family Residential to B-2 Highway Business.

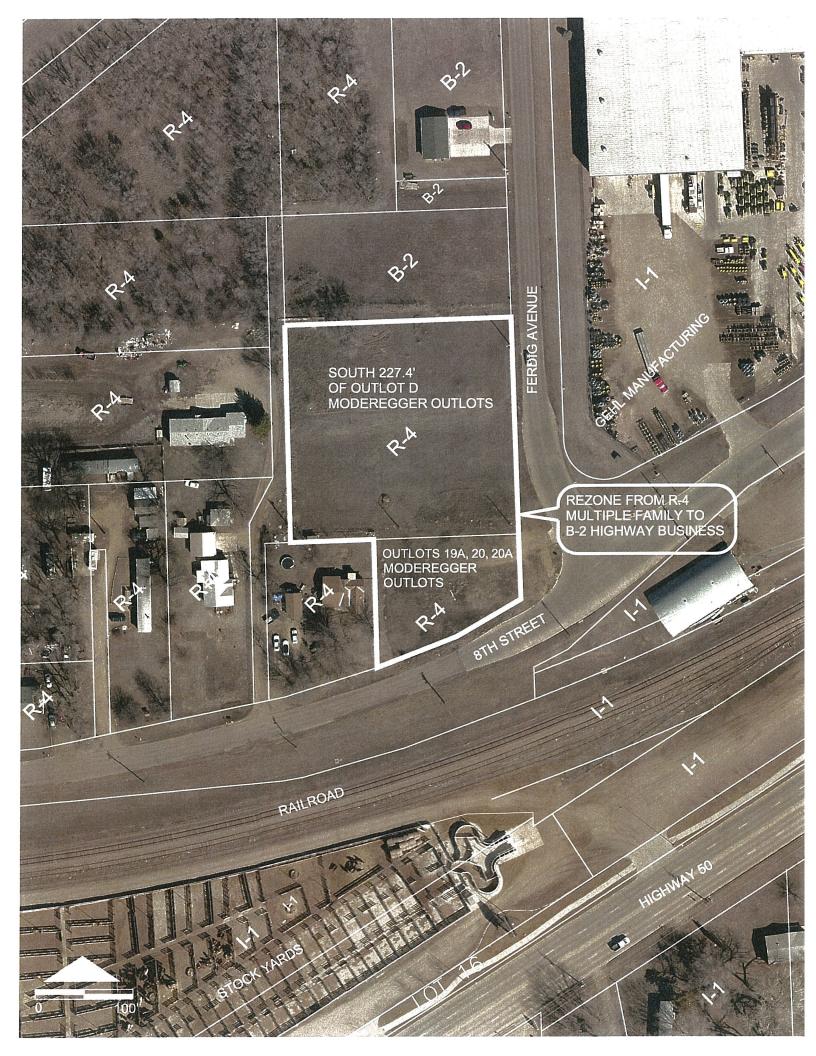

Sec. 16-23. - Discharge of weapons.

It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge or shoot off any description of firearm, or use for any purpose any slingshot or other device for throwing or forcing through the air missiles or projectiles of any character; however, this section shall not apply to any law enforcement officer in the discharge of his duty, or to any persons pre-authorized by the city manager for specific dates, times, and places.

The discharge of arrows shall be permitted at an approved location determined to be an archery range meeting the requirements of the National Field Archery Association, provided that the inspected, official archery range has been approved by the board of city commissioners.

The discharge of shotguns used on skeet shooting or shot gunning facilities shall also be permitted provided that said facility is permitted in the zoning district and has been approved by the board of city commissioners under the conditional uses and structures provision of the city's zoning ordinance.

In December of 2015, the City of Yankton contracted with Brosz Engineering of Sioux Falls, South Dakota for engineering services to replace the Pine Street Bridge. Brosz Engineering prepared construction plans and documents in order for the City to apply for shovel ready Bridge Improvement Grant (BIG) funding from the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) in January of 2016. The proposed design of the Pine Street Bridge closely resembles that of the Douglas Avenue Bridge which has sidewalk and railing on both sides of the bridge, jersey curb barriers with metal railing, and allowable space for a walking trail to pass underneath. The estimated cost for the Pine Street Bridge replacement, as currently designed, is \$1,500,841. The SDDOT announced in April the City had been awarded \$854,904.60 BIG grant funding for the 2017 bridge replacement project. The City portion of the project is estimated to be \$645,936.40.

Because of the historic value of the 1912 bridge, staff has investigated design options to preserve the architectural significance of the structure. Brosz has provided an addendum to the current contract to research the addition of historical features to the proposed Pine Street Bridge. Attached is the Proposal for Addendum 2 to the current contract.

The services to research additional historical features for the bridge and prepare a revision of the current construction plans to incorporate the features is estimated to cost \$7,500 and may extend the bid letting date past the originally anticipated October 2016 bid letting. There is currently \$1,500,841 budgeted in the Proposed 2017 Budget. Once Brosz Engineering completes research on the additional historic features, an estimate of the adjusted project cost will be provided.

It is recommended that the City Manager be authorized to enter an agreement with Brosz Engineering for services outlined in the attached Addendum. Services are projected to have an estimate cost of \$7,500.

I am submitting this Addendum 2 for additional work per our discussion a couple of weeks ago regarding the possibility of adding historical features from the existing Pine Street Bridge to the proposed bridge design.

As we discussed, it seems that it would be possible to relocate the spindles and top rail of the existing bridge into the design of outside pedestrian handrails of the proposed bridge. Additionally architectural reveal details could also be added to the abutment wing walls which replicates those of the existing bridge.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

- 1. Research options for the design of the outside pedestrian handrail of the proposed bridge that matches the existing side railing of the existing bridge and adding reveal details to the proposed abutment walls. Said details will be checked for compliance with current AASHTO Design Standards.
- 2. Develop side view elevation drawing and details for your review and comment.
- 3. Once the features have agreed upon, the current Construction Plans will be revised to incorporate those details.
- 4. Any additional services as you may require of us relating architectural enhancements to the proposed bridge.

My initial thoughts are to leave the currently design of Jersey Barrier with metal top railing (which separates the pedestrian and vehicular traffic) because Jersey Barriers are a crash tested railing.

TIME FOR COMPLETION:

Allow 2-3 weeks for research and design drawings for review and after a decision is made allow 2-3 weeks for Construction Plan Revisions.

FEES:

We will provide the above services on an hourly basis with an estimated amount to be \$7500.

The City has been asked to consider a partial sales tax reimbursement in support of a local retailer's expansion project. The City Commission has previously approved sales tax rebate agreements as an incentive to the development of retail projects in the community. Specifically, for those businesses in sectors where we are experiencing retail sales leakage. It appears there is cause to consider the same type of agreement related to the reuse of the former Save-U-More Building at 2401 Broadway Avenue.

Larry's Heating and Cooling Inc, / Slumberland is in the process of acquiring the site as a part of a move / expansion of their Slumberland business. Their proposal is to move the Slumberland Store and Larry's Heating and Cooling to the site from their current location at 920 Broadway Avenue. There would also be some space for an additional small business such as a restaurant. The attached Sales Tax Reimbursement Agreement provides the details of the proposal.

Furniture and Home Furnishings is listed as a sector of retail sales leakage in our region. Based on the recent Hoffman / Green Retail Market Study for Yankton, there is almost \$5 million dollars' worth of opportunity annually for additional furniture and home furnishings retail sales in our region. It is unrealistic to think that a majority of that could be captured by any new or expanded business in Yankton alone. But, an expansion of that type of business in Yankton could bring more of those dollars our way.

The basics of the proposal include a performance based reimbursement like those the City Commission has executed in the past. The reimbursement would only apply to those sales above the level of sales occurring at the retailer's current location. For example, if the retailer averaged \$1 million worth of taxable sales over the past three years at the current location, and sales go up to \$1.5 million at the new location, the reimbursement would only apply to the half a million dollars in sales increase that resulted from the move and expansion (i.e. performance based). As in other instances, the incentive is proposed to have limits. If approved, one-half of the City's two cent sales tax on all increased activity at the site would be reimbursed with a cap of \$300,000 or 20 years, whichever comes first.

The developer has a history of redevelopment successes in Yankton and is confident that the 920 Broadway location will not be vacant for long. There is also the chance that any new business wanting the old location could be considered for the same type of agreement in the future if it meets the City Commission's criteria.

SALES TAX AGREEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR LARRY'S HEATING AND COOLING, INC. BY AND AMONG LARRY'S HEATING AND COOLING, INC, YANKTON AREA PROGRESSIVE GROWTH AND THE CITY OF YANKTON, SOUTH DAKOTA

This agreement (the "Agreement"), made this _____ day of _____, 2016 by and among LARRY'S HEATING AND COOLING, INC, including Slumberland (hereinafter "Developer"), and the CITY OF YANKTON, SOUTH DAKOTA, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "City") and YANKTON AREA PROGRESSIVE GROWTH, a local Economic Development Corporation (hereinafter "YAPG").

WHEREAS, the Developer has committed to its best efforts to develop the former "Save-U-More" site located at 2401 Broadway Avenue legally described as Lots Two (2) and Three (3) Flake's Subdivision in the City and County of Yankton, South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the Developer plans to repurpose the site into the new expanded location for Slumberland and Larry's Heating and Cooling Inc. with the potential for additional space for a third occupancy; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested financial assistance in order to make the "property" competitively available for the described purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Developer and the City anticipate that the businesses, when operational, will provide significant economic benefits, including the generation of additional real property taxes and significant retail sales tax revenues for the City and other political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, reimbursement to the Developer, in the performance based manner as defined herein, by the City serves the public purpose of enabling the Developer to proceed with the described repurposing of the property thereby

eliminating a substantially underutilized site in the core of the City's Commercial corridor, thereby increasing economic development in the City and adding to the tax base, and further serving the public purpose of utilizing existing public improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to enter into this Agreement with YAPG and the Developer pursuant to SDCL §§ 9-54 and 9-12-11.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms hereinafter set forth, the City, YAPG and Developer do hereby contractually agree upon the following terms and conditions:

 Duty of Developer. The Developer hereby agrees to remodel / redevelop / repurpose the site to create a new, expanded Slumberland and Larry's Heating and Cooling business with the potential for an additional third occupancy.

2. **Definition of "City Sales Taxes."** "City sales taxes" as herein used refers to the following retail sales taxes imposed by the City on the effective date of this Agreement and actually collected from the operation of retail businesses located in the "Development" on the property legally described above: A municipal retail occupation sales and service tax upon the privilege of engaging in business a tax measured by two percent (2%) on the gross receipts of all persons engaged in business within the jurisdiction of the City of Yankton, Yankton County, South Dakota.

The City agrees to use its best efforts to refrain from modifying or replacing any ordinance affecting the "City sales tax," which is applicable to the property owners within the "Development," in order to avoid the "City Sales Tax" from falling below the two percent (2%) threshold.

3. **Reimbursement**. For twenty (20) years, from the time that the first occupancy permit is issued by the City on the site (anticipated in 2017), or until such time that \$300,000 has been reimbursed to the Developer, the City shall reimburse to YAPG, and YAPG shall reimburse to the Developer, fifty percent (50%) of the "City

sales tax" received from the "Development" that apply to the amount of increased sales tax paid over and above the Developer provided three-year historical average (2013 – 2015) for sales at the 920 Broadway Avenue location. Said three-year average equaling \$2,503,715.33. The reimbursement will be made annually with the reporting period ending on December 31st. Reimbursement to the Developer shall be due within sixty (60) days of the end of the year. Any taxes received above the two percent (2%) shall not be included in the calculation for reimbursement.

4. **Reimbursement Process**. The reimbursement process, for which the parties shall use their best efforts to see that reimbursement payments are made to Developer in accordance with the timeframes set forth herein, shall be as follows:

- a. Developer shall cause YAPG to be provided with proof of payment of "City Sales Taxes" generated from the "Development" within 20 days of the end of the reporting period. The information provided by the Developer to YAPG is private, proprietary and confidential, and in no manner shall it become a public record of the City.
- On behalf of the Developer, YAPG shall request payment of the sales tax reimbursement herein described from the City.
- c. The City shall deliver the sales tax reimbursement to YAPG, which shall only provide the same to the Developer.
- d. In the event that YAPG ceases to exist, or is unwilling or unable to perform its duties and obligations under this agreement, then the City shall partner with a similar entity to fulfill the third party obligations as undertaken by YAPG, as provided for under South Dakota law.

5. **YAPG Duty**. YAPG's sole contractual obligations herein are set forth in paragraphs four (4) and seven (7).

6. **Reimbursement Cap**. In no event will reimbursement by the City to the Developer through YAPG exceed \$300,000 over a maximum of twenty (20) years.

7. **Mutual Duties**. It shall be the mutual obligation of the City, YAPG and the Developer to identify, to track and to document City sales taxes.

8. **City's Budget**. The City will make the payments set forth in this Agreement and such payment will be budgeted and appropriated for the purposes set forth herein during the City's then current fiscal year. The City's obligation hereunder shall not in any way be construed to be a debt of the City in contravention of any applicable constitutional or statutory limitation or requirement concerning the creation of indebtedness by the City, nor shall anything contained herein constitute a pledge of the general credit, tax revenues, funds or moneys of the City.

9. **Specific Default**. Subject to any applicable cure periods, the following conditions, occurrences or actions will constitute a default by the Developer during the Term of this Agreement:

- Developer's insolvency, the appointment of a receiver for the Developer, or the filing of a voluntary or involuntary petition in bankruptcy respecting the Developer, or
- b. For property owned by the Developer, foreclosure of any lien against all or a portion of the described "property" or assignment or conveyance of the "property" in lieu of foreclosure which materially and adversely affects the "Development" prior to its completion.

10. **General Default**. In addition to specific default provisions identified in paragraph nine (9) herein, failure or delay by a party to perform any term or provision of this Agreement, after receiving written notice and failing to cure, as set forth below, constitutes a default under this Agreement. A party claiming default (the "Claimant") shall give written notice of default to the other party, specifying the default complained of.

11. **Cure Period**. The Claimant shall not institute proceedings against another party, nor be entitled to damages, if the other party, within fourteen (14) days after receipt of such written notice, with due diligence, commences to cure, correct or remedy such failure or delay and shall complete such cure, correction or remedy within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of such notice or, if such cure, correction, or remedy cannot reasonably be completed within thirty (30) days, it is diligently and continuously prosecuted until completion thereof.

12. Notices. Written notices, demands and communications between the City, YAPG and the Developer shall be sufficiently given by personal service or dispatched by first class mail, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or overnight courier, to the principal offices of the City, YAPG or the Developer. Such written notices, demands and communications may be sent in the same manner to such other addresses as either party may designate from time to time by mail as provided in this paragraph. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, notice personally served shall be deemed to have been received as of the date of such service or the date service is refused if written verification thereof is received from messenger service attempting such delivery.

13. Venue. Any legal actions related to or arising out of this Agreement must be instituted in the Circuit Court of Yankton County, South Dakota.

14. **Law Governing**. The laws of the State of South Dakota shall govern the interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement, without giving effect to the choice of law rules thereof.

15. **Cumulative Remedies**. Except as otherwise expressly stated in this Agreement, the right and remedies of the parties are cumulative, and the exercise by either party of one or more of such rights or remedies shall not preclude the exercise by it, at the same or different times, of any other rights or remedies for the same default or any other default by the other party.

16. **Waiver**. Any failures or delays by either party in asserting any of its rights and remedies as to any default shall not operate as a waiver of any default or of any such rights or remedies, or deprive a party of its right to institute and to maintain

any action or proceedings which it may deem necessary to protect, to assert or to enforce any such rights or remedies.

17. **Amendments**. The Developer and the City agree to mutually consider reasonable requests for amendments to this Agreement which may be made by either or both of the parties, provided said requests are consistent with this Agreement and would not substantially alter the basic business terms included herein.

18. **Brokers**. The City shall not be liable for any claims of brokers, agents or finders, licensed or unlicensed, and all such claims of real estate or other consultants which exist or may arise with respect to the "Development."

19. Severability. It is the intention of the parties that the provisions of this Agreement shall be enforced to the fullest extent permissible under the laws of South Dakota, and the unenforceablability (or modification to conform to such laws or public policies) of any provision hereof shall not render them unenforceable, or impair, the remainder of this Agreement. Accordingly, if any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed amended to delete or modify, in whole or in part, if necessary, the invalid or unenforceable provision or provisions, or portion thereof, and to alter the balance of this Agreement in order to render the same valid and enforceable.

20. **Counterparts**. This Agreement is executed in duplicate originals, each of which is deemed to be an original. This Agreement includes pages one (1) through nine (9), which includes the three (3) pages upon which the parties' signatures are located, which constitute the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

21. Integration & Amendments. This Agreement integrates all of the terms and conditions mentioned herein or incidental hereto, and supersedes all negotiations or previous agreements between the parties or their predecessors in interest with respect to all or part of the subject matter hereof. All amendments must be in writing executed by the appropriate authorities of the City, YAPG, and the Developer.

22. **Headings**. The title of each Article and the headings or titles preceding the text of the Sections are inserted solely for convenience of reference and shall not constitute a part of this Agreement, nor shall they affect the meaning, construction or effect of this Agreement.

23. Scriveners. The parties have participated jointly in the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. Developer is a sophisticated business person. In the event that an ambiguity or question of intent or interpretation arises, this Agreement shall be construed as if drafted jointly by the parties and no presumption or burden of proof shall arise favoring or disfavoring a party by virtue of the authorship of any of the provisions of this Agreement.

24. **Authority**. Both parties covenant that they have authority to enter into this agreement. In addition, the Developer and YAPG covenant that they are in good standing in their jurisdiction of creation.

25. **Assignment**. Developer may not assign or pledge any of its rights hereunder without the prior written consent of the City.

The attached documentation outlines a requirement of the South Dakota Housing Authority's (SDHA) financing program. As you know, Costello Companies is in the process of purchasing City owned land in Fox Run based on a previous City Commission action. The site will be the future home of Phase II of the Yankton Heights Apartments. It will be a 30 unit income eligible apartment building very similar to Phase I that is located just to the east.

SDHA program requirements include an action supporting the project by the City Commission. The attached resolution provides the necessary description of Commission support needed and also authorizes the Mayor to sign a letter of support.

The City Commission has provided this type of support for other SDHA eligible housing projects in Yankton in the past. The draft letter from the Mayor references a market study which is underway right now. We will provide paper copies of it at the meeting if it is completed in time.

Dear Mayor Gross:

We plan to submit an application to the South Dakota Housing Development Authority (SDHDA) in August 2016 to request financing for a thirty (30) unit apartment complex in Yankton. If our application is successful, construction would start in the spring of 2017 and units would be available to lease in the summer of 2018. The application to SDHDA requires a letter of support signed by the Mayor of the community in which the project is being proposed.

Enclosed is a development narrative including a picture of the apartment building. This building will be constructed adjacent to the existing Yankton Heights Apartment building that was completed in 2015, located in the Fox Run Subdivision.

The proposed new building will consist of six (6) one-bedroom units, sixteen (16) two-bedroom units, and eight (8) three-bedroom units. The building will include a clubhouse on the main floor with a full kitchen, two restrooms and maintenance storage. Each apartment unit will be furnished with a refrigerator, range, microwave/hood, dishwasher, washer and dryer, window blinds, central air and a high efficiency furnace. Two of the units will be fully handicapped accessible and one unit will be equipped for a hearing or visually impaired person. The site will include a children's playground and picnic area with a picnic table and an outdoor

grill. The units will be rented to individuals and families earning between 30% and 60% of the area median income.

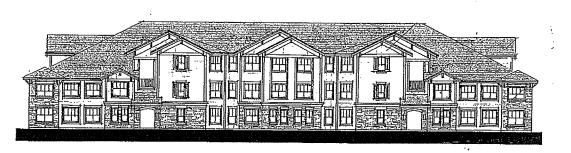

Yankton Heights II Apartments Yankton, SD

Yankton Heights II Apartments is a proposed 30 unit multi-family complex located in Yankton. The 30 units will be within one (1) three-story building architecturally called the "E-Urban" plan. This is a patented architectural plan developed by Humphreys and Partners Architects, Dallas, Texas. The building's overall net rentable square footage to gross square footage is efficient both structurally and financially.

The single three-story building will consist of six (6) one-bedroom units, sixteen (16) two-bedroom units and eight (8) three-bedroom units. This development, with a total of 30 units, will serve families and individuals of all ages. Three (3) units will be designed to accommodate persons with disabilities (one for the hearing and visually impaired; and two for mobility-impaired persons.)

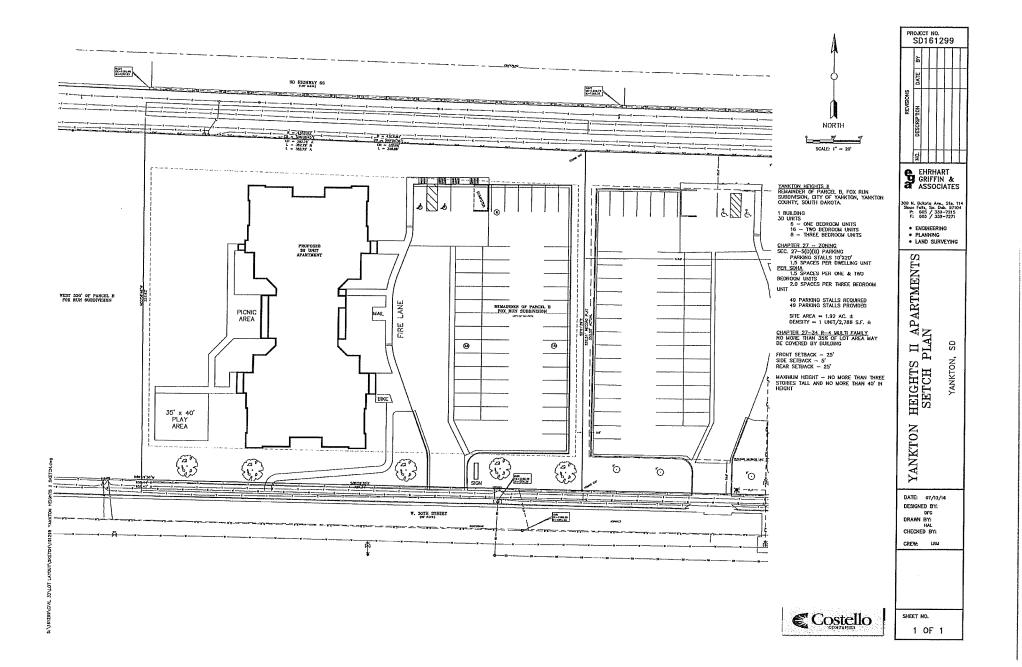
The units have rents structured for tenants at or below 60% of the area median income (AMI). One (1) of the units will be set aside for tenants at or below 30% AMI, three (3) units will be set aside at or below 40% AMI, nine (9) units will be for those individuals qualifying at or below 50% AMI, and seventeen (17) units will be for those tenants that qualify at or below 60% AMI. Ten (10) of the units will be designated as floating HOME units.

Development amenities include central air conditioning; washers and dryers in each unit; all appliances including a refrigerator, range, microwave/hood combo, disposal, and dishwasher; stone wainscot that helps lower heating and cooling costs, as well as, adds decorative style; and window blinds. The one-bedroom units are 752 square feet and have one bathroom, the two-bedroom units range between 935 and 964 square feet and have two bathrooms, and the three-bedroom units have 1,317 square feet and have two bathrooms. Each unit will be wired for phone, cable TV and high speed internet service. All entrances will have a secured access system allowing access to common areas. Tenants are responsible for electric and gas utilities, telephone, internet and cable TV. The complex pays for water, sewer and trash service. Site amenities include a clubhouse with a full kitchen, two bathrooms, and maintenance storage; a children's playground, park bench, bike racks and a picnic area with a picnic table and grill. The landscaping will include several trees and an underground sprinkler system.

Green features of the development will include rain sensors for the lawn sprinkler system, low flow faucets, showerheads and toilets, Energy Star appliances, all light fixtures will have energy saving light bulbs and units will have low VOC carpet and low VOC paint, stains and adhesives. It is the owner's intent to have each unit and the project Energy Star Certified by a third party HERS (Home Energy Rating System) rater.

The project will be financed with Low Income Housing Tax Credits and a HOME Loan from the South Dakota Housing Development Authority. The project will also require a permanent loan from a mortgage company and will have a construction loan during the construction period.

Applications for financing will be made in August 2016 with awards of financing announced in November 2016. Construction would start in spring 2017 and will be complete in the summer of 2018.
