- Clarification on zero-depth and proximity to main pool (Commissioner)

- Look at all age groups when preparing plans
- Make attractive for families
- Need facility that will draw people to town
- Growing communities do things to attract families to move to the community
- Create social opportunities

- Community has spoke on what the upper limit should be
- Failed vote does not mean we should do nothing
- The longer we delay decisions, the more inflation means we do less for the same amount
- Time to move the discussion forward
- Build some amenities with donations, not all taxes
- Middle-ground on costs, that’s where most families are
- Modesty in amenities, not going over the top
- Need something new
- Have facility that conveys the community’s pride
- How long will existing plumbing last
- Consider total space available around current facility
- Plan new pool in stages
- What can we get for \$3 – 4 million
- 3rd phase of T.F. – Donations
- Creative financing to pay for new facility
- Marketing plan for facility
- Rates would have to go up with new facility
- Routine maintenance to slow deterioration of current or new facility

- Non-resident fund-raiser
- Taxing mechanism for non-residents

- Bathhouse's current condition concerns
- New bathhouse
- Bath house is concern
- Family locker room
- Restrooms and bath house in relation to young kids area, zero-depth

- Currently, the separate wading pool means older children using main pool are not under supervision of parents with young children in wading pool
- Parents separated from all their kids- main pool versus wading pool
- Being able to supervise children of different ages and abilities in one facility
- Concerns about safety at current facility
- Better adult supervision (little boy who fell off of high dive)
- Currently, haphazard placement of amenities
- Placement of current amenities

- ADA Accessibility issues
- Need new pool that is accessible (ADA and all ages)
- Public facility needs to be ADA compliant and accessible

- Swim team needs 8 lanes
- Maintain 8 lanes
- Ability to host swim meets should be considered
- Positive economic impact when hosting large swim meets

- Don't include sand volleyball
- Sand play area for children

- Separate zero-depth pool with fencing
- Need zero-depth
- Abandon wading pool

- Shade umbrellas in zero-depth area
- Shade

- Concessions inside fence

- \$4-5 million was consensus of group present
