




Local Chapter Goals:

Local Chapter Fundraising:


- All funds raised by the Yankton Area Chapter are controlled by the Chapter.

Local Chapter Expenditures:


Yankton Area Chapter:







Pollinators and Pheasant Habit:


- Not only is pollinator habitat good for the bees, butterflies and beetles.
- Provides excellent brood rearing habitat for pheasants, quail and grassland songbirds.
- Pollinator habitat / native flowering plants: attract soft-bodied insects that pheasant chicks, and other ground-nesting chicks need as a food source
- Pheasant chicks rely on these insects for survival during the first 6-8 weeks of life






Diverse vegetation, allow small pheasant chick to search for bugs for food.



Wildflower Project:


- Yankton Area Chapter initiated the project










Wildflower Project

- Aesthetically pleasing to all outdoor enthusiasts






