A) Public Perspectives of Parks and Recreation in South Dakota: Public Survey Results from SCORP (Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan).

The outcomes of this presentation for the conference participants are: Understanding the overall public perspective of parks and recreation in South Dakota. Utilizing an online survey for public input and feedback in parks and recreation. Analyzing both qualitative and quantitative data for future recommendations in promoting outdoor recreation.

➤ B) Managing Millennials: Working With the "Y" Factor.

Employers, department managers and supervisors are frustrated with the turnover rate of young employees as well as the cost associated with hiring replacements. There is also a lack of problem solving-skills with younger employees that result in poor customer service. The flip side is that the Gen "Y" or "millennial" as well as the youngest of the workforce, Gen "Z" are reporting a lack of training to handle a variety of issues on the job as well as the need for a more supportive and mentor type role from their direct supervisor.

By addressing the needs of younger employees, identifing areas of concern and providing adequate training, the turnover rate can be reduced, competent and qualified employees will be retained and the level of customer satisfaction will increase.

> E) South Dakota Department of Tourism.

In this session we will discuss how we use various research methods to find potential visitors and use information we learn about them to customize our creative, message and marketing channels. Effective marketing comes down to speaking to our visitors at the right time, at the right place, with the right message. Direct outreach and development initiatives. Website data, Facebook data, geo-fencing.

Presenters:

Kirk Hulstein- South Dakota Department of Tourism Industry Outreach and Development Director. He has been with the department for 11 years and provides support and assistance to the communities and businesses within the tourism industry. His team delivers information about cooperative programs, marketing campaigns, consumer trends and marketing research. > F) Quality Grant Writing.

Session will provide an overview of funding opportunities available for recreational projects. Discussion will focus upon Federal and State grant programs commonly utilized within South Dakota and their impacts upon local governments. Elements of grant writing will be explored via actual case studies of successful grant processes detailing the transition from idea to fruition.

➤ G) Personal Traits and Leadership.

This session will use DISC, a behavior assessment tool based on the DISC theory of psychologist William Moulton Marston, which centers on four different behavioral traits: dominance, inducement, submission, and compliance. It does not measure intelligence, aptitude, mental health or values. DISC profiles describe human behavior in various situations. For example, the DISC questionnaire asks about how you respond to challenges, how you influence others, how you respond to rules and procedures, and about your preferred pace of activity. In this session, attendees will identify their style and then the group will discuss how that style influences both work and home environments.

H) Aquatic Invasive Species

Aquatic invasive species pose a threat economically and ecologically across the United States. Invasion into South Dakota is currently limited, but invasive species such as zebra mussels, bigheaded carps, and curly leaf pondweed pose imminent threats as they spread across the state. Understanding the ecology and impacts of these species is important for implementing proper management decisions.

Presenter:

BJ Schall, Fisheries Biologist South Dakota Game, Fish & Parks- BJ graduated with a Bachelor's degree from South Dakota State University in 2011 and a Master's degree in biology from the University of Nebraska at Kearney, where he conducted research on the distribution and population dynamics of the multiple fish species in Lake McConaughy, Nebraska. He started with the SD GFP in June 2017 to manage the aquatic invasive species operations in the southeastern portion of South Dakota.

> 1) GIS Technology: Powering Yankton's Parks and Recreation in to the Digital Age.

As inquiring people requiring information instantly at their fingertips surges, GIS (Geographic Information System) technology can be there to help. This session will focus on how GIS has helped turn previously static paper/tabular data into visually appealing, user friendly, web applications that make finding the information everyone is looking for a quicker, easier, and more efficient process. ➤ J) design:SD and the 2017 Yankton Project.

design:SD helps small towns shape their future by design. The design:SD event utilizes a charrette model to work with towns throughout South Dakota. The three-day design event can help communities to dream about the future, and recognize how important design is to that future. It can bring people together and energize them toward a shared vision—a better way to see our community. Downtown Yankton, which is now branded as the Meridian District, went through this process with City of Yankton staff involved with all parts of the design planning. A two-block stretch of Walnut Avenue, from 4th Street to 2nd Street, will utilize the ideas from the 2017 effort to create a pedestrian friendly connection of the Meridian District to the Meridian Bridge Plaza and Riverside Park.

➤ K) Find Your Park: The Missouri National Recreational River

Grab a paddle and make a splash with Daniel Peterson, Chief of Interpretation, Education and Outreach with the Missouri National Recreational River—a unit of the National Park Service -as he takes us on a 98-mile wild and scenic journey through a national park located on the boarder of Nebraska and South Dakota.

Dan assumed his position at the Missouri National Recreational River as the Chief of Interpretation, Education, and Outreach in April 2016 where his responsibilities include contributing to and complimenting traditional interpretive programming for the Park, as well as serving as the liaison to the Park's friends group, editor of the Park's newsletter, Webmaster, and coordinating the Park's social media outlets.

ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) Training classes provide preparation and a plan for individuals and organizations on how to more proactively handle the threat of an aggressive intruder or active shooter event. ALICE Training option-based tactics have become the accepted response, versus the traditional "lockdown only" approach. Protection and safety must be the priority in an active shooter event or terrorist attack. Circumstantial and operational concerns vary in every new situation.
