III. NEW BUSINESS

A. Parks improvements update for 2018.

- 1. Fall 2018- Reshape the north infield at SAC in 2019.
 - o 30' feet of agri-lime would need to be removed from the entire outfield/infield transition line from fence line to fence line (approximately 260' in length, total area of 7,800 square feet). Black dirt would need to be hauled in and prepare that 7,800 square feet area for grass seed. That area would need to be seeded with grass. Irrigation lines would need to be added to the irrigation system to water the new outfield grass strip that was created. The school district is having issues with the irrigation system on those fields since it is 25 years old. Due to this irrigation issue, the parks staff decided to delay the project to another year.
- 2. October 22 through November 9- new Heat, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning (HVAC) unit will be installed for the pool. The pool floor tile will be replaced and grouted. The main entrance doors and windows into the pool area will also be replaced.
- 3. New swing set, two-bay, for Morgen Park. Fund raised by Larry Nickels. Will reduce three sand diggers down to one. Sand fall material will be removed and wood chips will be installed. Sand digger will have its own sand pit.
- 4. Sand digger will be added to Ridgeway Park. Funded by an adjacent property owner. Sand digger will have its own pit of sand.
- 5. Matt and Tracey Dovorak want to donate funds for a shelter at Sertoma Park.

- Working with Mead Lumber to build shelter on-site. \$6,500 initial quote but need to make some additions. City needs to do concrete pad for shelter.
- The shelter will be located to the east of the four-plex concession stand. Just off the asphalt to the east.

The Parks Advisory Board recommended that the City Commission support the Dive-In-Yankton project and approve the funding proposed without placing the project on a special election. Crandall motion.
