New play equipment will be installed in 2022. The Yankton Territorial Museum is working to have buildings removed in the fall of 2021 and the spring of 2022.

There was a second group meeting to discuss more baseball and softball fields. The group consists of The Yankton Baseball Association, Yankton Sertoma Club, The Yankton Girls Softball Association, Mount Marty University Softball, and Men's Slow-Pitch Softball Association. An update can be given on what this group is discussing for the future. Girls' softball has been added as a sanctioned sport for the high school starting in 2022 and the South Dakota High School Athletic Association is still working to determine when the season will be played (spring or fall). The preliminary plan would be to utilize fields at Sertoma Park until the SAC facility can be updated to the fields are regulation for high school softball.
